Cinco de Mayo

Columbia CA, was at some point in time, a culturally and linguistically diverse area, including the Latin-American/Hispanic community, which has been present in the region for generations. In 1862, when civil wars were ravaging Mexico and US, the victory of the Battle of Puebla over Napoleon III brought a spontaneous celebration in Columbia, giving birth to "Cinco de Mayo, an American Tradition".

On May 4th & 5th Columbia State Park will be decorated in festive Cinco de Mayo style. We will celebrate with dances on the street, music, and art displays, in honor of the victory that preserved democracy and freedom in both countries.

Visit Columbia Museum for a magnificent exhibit telling the history of Cinco de Mayo.

This is a family event featuring Los Arribeños a California Fandango project, Raices del Mundo Folklorico ballet, Mariachi Luz de Luna, Salsa Dance, Mario Flores Latin Jazz Band and Rod Harris, as well as vendors and activities for children and adults!

May 16-19; 10-4 p.m. - Cost: \$10 Adults, \$2 children ages 5 to 17

Diggins Tent Town (located near main parking lot in Columbia State Historic Park)

Step back in time to the year 1852 and discover what life was like in a gold diggings encampment during the early Gold Rush period. Over 150 volunteers help to recreate this time in history by living the life of a miner, merchant, actor/actress, and more. Explore the tent town and discover a way of life not seen in California for over 150 years.

Park visitors are welcome all four days of the event; however, note on Thursday and Friday Diggins will be full of 4th graders. It is best to visit on Saturday and Sunday.
